

Make Stratford Safe - Remove the Toxic Waste

Problem:

Toxic Raymark waste threatens public health and the environment in our town.

- There are more than 24 toxic waste sites left over from Raymark even after the big clean-up at the Home Depot/Walmart complex, including residential properties, wetlands, Raybestos Memorial Ballfield and the landfill near Short Beach.
- The \$21 million dollars that the EPA has proposed to spend on clean-up won't even cover the cheapest of clean-up options.
- Scientific studies show that there is no safe level of exposure for asbestos, lead, and PCBs.



Solution:

- The EPA must fully, safely, and quickly remove all toxic soil from Stratford to protect public health, the environment, and the quality of life for the long-term.
- Citizens need to be involved in any plans for cleaning up Raymark's legacy of toxic waste. If complete removal cannot be done safely near residential homes then the EPA must explore options together with those residents who would be directly affected.
- The EPA must allocate more funding to pay for a proper cleanup.
